

NAMI Ozaukee is kicking off a new support group specifically for those living with a mental health condition. Peers are invited to attend to talk, listen, support and connect with each other. The group will meet on March 9th and the 2nd Thursday of each month thereafter. Vydas Dargis and Donna O'Connell will facilitate.

Meet Your Peer Support Group Facilitators



Vydas and Donna received Certificates of Completion for their peer support facilitator training. The training consisted of a full weekend of online classes. The Peer Support training was facilitated by NAMI Wisconsin.



NAMI Ozaukee is now offering a NAMI Homefront Education Program, a six-week class for the families, friends and significant others of Military Service Members and Veterans with mental health conditions. It focuses on the unique needs of Military and Veteran support persons by helping them to understand and aid their loved one while maintaining their own well-being.

The course is presented by trained teachers who are also the supporters of Veterans and Military Personnel. They have experience with military culture and know what it is like to have a loved one living with symptoms of a mental health condition such as PTSD.

NAMI Ozaukee, the local affiliate of the National Alliance on Mental Illness, will offer the Homefront Education Program from April 4th to May 8th, 2023. Class will meet in Grafton on six consecutive Tuesdays from 6pm to 8:30pm. There is no charge. Class size is limited, so call 262-243-3627 to reserve a spot early.

10 Common Signs of a Mental Health Condition

Feeling sad or with- drawn for more than two weeks	Seeing/hearing or believing things that are not real
Trying to harm or end one's life or, planning such	Excessive use of alcohol, drugs or both
Severe risk taking that causes harm to self or others	Drastic changes in mood, behavior, personality or sleeping habits
Sudden overwhelm- ing fear/anxiety for no reason	Extreme difficulty in concentrating, staying still leading to physical danger
Throwing up, using laxatives or, not eating to lose weight	Intense worry or fear that get in the way of daily activities.
