You Are Not Alone!

(Four simple words with a powerful meaning)

Recently, the U.S. Surgeon General (Vivek H. Murthy, MD) called loneliness an epidemic which adversely affects health, happiness, and social connections. National NAMI indicates that this is especially true for individuals living with a mental illness and their families. Dr. Murthy found that individuals can feel alone even in a crowd. Also, many college students report that loneliness is one of their biggest challenges even when surrounded by others.

In his groundbreaking book; <u>Together: The Healing Power of Human</u> <u>Connection in a Sometimes Lonely World</u>, Dr. Murthy says that many of us are walking around with a hidden secret of loneliness. We rarely share this with others because of the stigma associated with expressing feelings of loneliness.

Loneliness can be situational, it can come and go, and it can be pervasive. No one is immune; and loneliness is more widespread than most of us realize. The CDC, NAMI, Dr. Murthy, and Help Guide have several suggestions for us.

First, realize "You are not alone!" There are many others who feel the same and would be glad to help and share. Therefore, reach out to others by inviting them for coffee, lunch, and/or a walk. Join a club, volunteer your time (especially with organizations that help others), and get out of your house/apartment into the fresh air. Talk with your family about loneliness and schedule regular times to talk, either personally or by phone. Use other ways to keep in touch with friends and family such as email, text, facetime, and personal visits.

Participate in one or more of NAMI Ozaukee social events which includes bowling every Monday as a spectator or bowler. Also, attend the pizza and movie night on the second Friday of each month and Nosh night every fourth Friday. All of these are at Circle B Recreation and listed in this newsletter. Everyone is welcome!

If loneliness becomes too much to bear and you feel overwhelmed, seek counseling or call NAMI Ozaukee. We are here to help, because you are not alone. Finally, if you just want to talk, you can call us at 262-243-2637 or you can email me directly at drweber9097@att.net, or call me at 262-689-2270.

Crisis Intervention Partners Training




CIP is a 16 hour program presented in part by our Past-President, Mary Luzinski, and our President, Dr. Michael Weber, in addition to those credited below. CIP programs are meant to foster ongoing partnerships between first responders, advocacy, mental health and other community stakeholders. The target audience are 911 dispatchers, emergency personnel, hospital staff, teachers, social workers and more. The participants gain a better understanding of and improve interactions with people who experience mental health crisis.

CIT #13 was held May 7-8, 2024 at the Grafton Fire Department with a total of 25 in attendance. There were attendees from Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office, Washington County Sheriff's Office, Thiensville PD, Saukville PD, Southern Ozaukee FD, Clerk of Courts, Lumen Christi Church-Mequon, Prime Horizon, Sirona Recovery. The addition of community members added a new dimension to the training and was appreciated by all the attendees.

Our next Family to Family Class begins Tuesday, September 10, 2024 from 6:00pm to 8:30pm and continues for 9 consecutive Tuesdays, taught by Jeff Graf, Susan Sellin and Jeanette Koch. The class is designed for adult family members, friends, and significant others of persons living with mental illness. The course includes information on illnesses such as major depression, bipolar disorder, schizophrenia and other mental health disorders. Also included are strategies for communicating with the loved one, maintenance of the supporter's own health and minimizing life disruption. The program is taught by trained volunteers who have lived experience supporting loved ones with mental health disorders. What does NAMI do and how can we help?

Past-President, Mary Luzinski, and President, Dr. Michael Weber, put their considerably capable heads together to compile the following list of "What does NAMI do and how can we help? It is really quite impressive.

- Our focus is Advocacy, Education, Support, Awareness and Socialization for the individuals living w/a mental illness.
- We are available to provide mental illness awareness and support training to your organization. We have three support groups monthly: Family Support, Family to Family Class, and Peer Support.
- We have several social events: weekly bowling, a pizza night; a nosh night; and a cookout each month, also several field trips; a spring picnic; and a holiday banquet.
- We are helping organize and participate in a NAMI Walk on October 5th in Sheboygan to help bring awareness and support to individuals suffering with mental illness and their families.
- There are three golf outings that we attend or provide literature and information.
- We have a youth initiative by working with the schools in Ozaukee County and the YMCA in Saukville.
- We are available to make presentations to both public and private schools students and staff, and assist colleges in starting an on-campus program for their students.
- We provide suicide prevent training and training on dealing with negative people and acceptance/expanded view of diversity.
- We work closely with law enforcement to provide training for first responders and law enforcement officers. We participate in Cops and Kids and the National Night Out for Ozaukee County.
- ♦ We attend the Jewish Food Festival as a group.
- We work with Washington County on a joint Washington/Ozaukee Health Department Mental Health Committee.
- We are currently promoting 988 and 211 resources in the community.
- Our office is located at the ONC in Grafton; and we participate in several events with them.

	Severe risk taking that causes harm to self or others	Drastic changes in mood, be- havior, personality or sleeping habits		
	Sudden overwhelming fear/anxiety for no reason	Extreme difficulty in concentrating, staying still leading to physical danger		
	Throwing up, using laxatives or, not eating to lose weight	Intense worry or fear that get in the way of daily activities.
