Three questions to ask yourself to help choose your friends and therapist/counselor

We all need a support system of friends, family, and possibly a therapist/counselor. How do we know if these people "have our backs"? We can determine the strength of those supports and whether they will be there for us through good and bad times, by using the three question technique. Renowned author and researcher, John Maxwell, offers a great suggestion which I have personally found to be very helpful.

In any relationship, ask yourself three important questions:

Do you care for me?

Can I trust you?

Can you help me?

If the answer to any one of these questions is no, then you might want to evaluate your relationship with this person because during challenging times, you need people who care about you, that you can trust, and that can help you.

What I have discovered by using this three question technique as a friend to someone else is that I try to show I care, that I can be trusted, and that I can help by setting aside my own needs to focus on the other person. Also, when applying this technique to someone I want to build a relationship with, if I answer no any one of these questions, I work at helping the other person to know me better. If I cannot change the no answer to a yes, I let the relationship go, and know that I will need to reach out to someone else during challenging times.

Therefore care for your friends, trust them, and help them. They will return the favor and you will have built strong relationships that will be with you through the good and bad times. Then cherish them and be thankful that they are in your life.

NAMI Ozaukee Holds Crisis Intervention Training No. 17

NAMI Ozaukee's Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) No.17 was held on October 7-11 at the Ozaukee Sheriff's Office and Concordia University. There were 22 officers from 14 departments: Ozaukee and Richland County Sheriff's Department and the Police Departments of Port Washington, Saukville, Mequon, Thiensville, Sheboygan Falls, Kohler, Plymouth, Fall River, Fond du Lac, Lake Geneva, Oneida, and UW-Milwaukee.

Concordia University Theater students role played in different scenarios depicting individuals in a mental

health crisis giving participating officers the opportunity to practice skills they learned during the 40-hour Crisis Intervention Training. The student actors were Joshua Bowen, Wyatt Michaels, Tirzah Schmickle, Rivkah Schmickle, Elani Dalianis, Lilly Keller (Teegan), Aimee Zanter Krawczyk, Magdalena Horn, and Courtney Marie Reid.

Our own Past President Mary Luzinski and current NAMI Ozaukee President Dr. Michael Weber are part of the CIT presenting team. The program is designed to promote an understanding of individuals who experience mental illness and the family/loved ones who support them.

The CIT training is funded by NAMI Ozaukee and a grant from NAMI Wisconsin.

-	Feeling sad or with- drawn for more than two weeks	Seeing/hearing or believing things that are not real
	Trying to harm or end one's life or, planning such	Excessive use of alcohol, drugs or both
	Severe risk taking that causes harm to self or others	Drastic changes in mood, be- havior, personality or sleeping habits
	Sudden overwhelming fear/anxiety for no reason	Extreme difficulty in concentrating, staying still leading to physical danger
	Throwing up, using laxatives or, not eating to lose weight	Intense worry or fear that get in the way of daily activities.
